

### 2021 Continuum of Care (CoC) Grant Competition project listing

### 1. Orange County

Rapid-Rehousing

Will provide essential supportive services for 40 households who are currently experiencing homelessness in Orange County.

New funding request to expand a best practice program currently operating with ESG and HOME grant support.

## 2. Orange County

Supportive Services Only – Coordinated Entry

Will provide expansion to 3 FTE to provide system wide access to homeless services, including assessment and program referrals

#### 3. Inter-Faith Council for Social Services

**Permanent Supportive Housing** 

Will provide renewal rental assistance and supportive services to 18 chronically homeless single adults. Reducing this project will displace vulnerable adults who are currently utilizing best practice supportive services in order to maintain housing. This will exacerbate an existing gap in the <a href="Homeless System Gaps Analysis">Homeless System Gaps Analysis</a> (page 5).

## 4. Community Link

**Permanent Supportive Housing** 

Will provide renewal rental assistance to fifteen households. This project is being reduced and reallocated as it's not currently meeting HUD thresholds and does not run the model for Permanent Supportive Housing that includes both rental assistance and case management. Staff will work with Community Link to ensure minimal impact and to avoid displacement of persons currently stably housed, including potentially connecting tenants to Housing Choice Vouchers.

# 5. Compass Center

DV Bonus – Expand current Rapid Re-housing project to serve DV Survivors and their Families HUD allows CoC's to apply for Bonus projects as a way to increase the annual renewal demand. Additional funding will increase capacity to serve an additional three adults and three children.

### 6. Compass Center

Rapid Re-housing to serve DV Survivors and their Families

This expansion project will serve four adults and 4 children. The Project Review Committee recommends this project to be reduced and reallocated as it is not currently meeting HUD threshold. Reducing this project will exacerbate an existing gap in the <a href="Homeless System Gaps">Homeless System Gaps</a> <a href="Analysis">Analysis</a> (page 4) and will reduce the likelihood of successful implementation of DV Bonus funds.
