



Homelessness is increasing







Subpopulations are seeing different

- Most chronic homeless identified since 2010








The Path Forward

 - Medical respite beds
 - Bridge Housing



- SERVICES CONNECTIONS
 - Housing Helpline staffing
 - Crisis/Diversion FacilityIntegrated Service Center



- SERVICES DIGNITY
 - 24 hour bathrooms
 - Memorial service funding



It is less expensive to fill gaps than to continue homelessness

Less expensive to fill gaps than to continue homelessness Filling gaps results in taxpayer savings



Costs are **10-20 times** higher for people experiencing **chronic homelessness** vs. **first-time homelessness**. More than \$35,000 higher per year on average.
