



## People Experiencing Homelessness in Orange County 2015-2020

The Orange County Partnership to End Homelessness last submitted this data from the Point in Time (PIT) to the Dept. of Housing & Urban Development in April 2020. PIT data uses the HUD homeless definition and counts people living in shelters, transitional housing, and places not meant for human habitation and does not count people living with others (doubled up or couch surfing) or people staying in institutions like hospitals, jails, substance use treatment programs.
