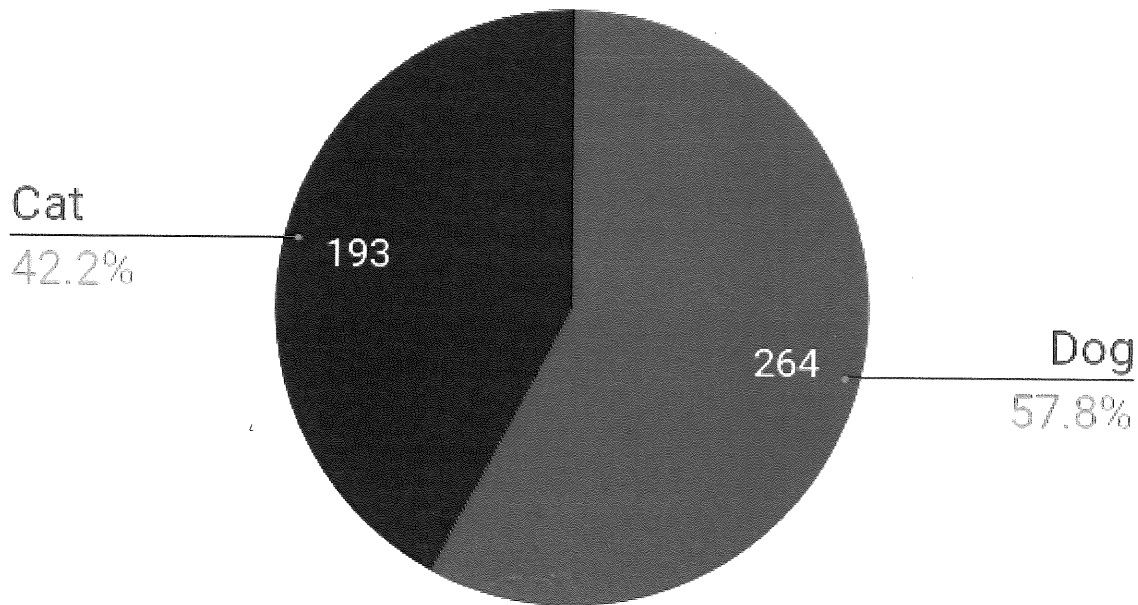


Reasons for Surrender

Of 458 Animal Surrendered, Reasons Cited (could be multiple for animal)

Reason	Description	Number
Housing	Lost home, landlord won't allow pet, homeless, at risk of homelessness	58
Financial	Can't afford care, food, supplies, vet, vaccines, no money, pet medical reasons	79
Pet behavior	Unruly behavior, house soiling, litter box issues, scratching, barking, biting, energy	99
Life changes	Moving, new child, marriage, job, no time for pet, divorce, person illness	188
