

Priorities for 2017 Plan to End Homelessness	2015 Plan Actions
Increase Access to Stable and Affordable Housing	RRH: Increase Rapid Re-Housing capacity, advocate for local funding and other sources
	PSH: Increase Permanent Supportive Housing units, advocate for local funding and other sources
	Rental units: Increase rental units for households with incomes below 30% of Area Median Income.
	Rental units: Increase the number of landlords that will rent to people experiencing or at risk of homelessness and participate in rental housing voucher/subsidy programs.
	Rental units: Convene a meeting of community stakeholders including OC Housing and DSS, Justice United, Nate Broman-Fulks, Sarah Vinas, Frank Cohen, and others
	Rental units: Survey agencies to determine what they are doing to recruit/ keep landlords, what their greatest needs are, etc.
	Rental units: Advocate for Housing Resource Specialist/Housing Locator position to be established.
	ConPlan: Support the development of Orange County's 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plans that will identify unmet needs for affordable housing and effective strategies for increasing affordable housing.
	Public Housing: Increase the number of TOCH public housing units available to people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
	Public Housing: Increase the number of OC Housing Choice (Section 8) Vouchers available to people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
	Tiny Homes: Explore feasibility of creating small/tiny homes as a solution for increasing affordable housing opportunities.
	Advocacy: Advocate for funding and policy positions at local government budget hearings and other public hearings/ meetings, including changes to local government land use ordinances and zoning regulations to facilitate affordable housing development including infill, accessory apartments, tiny homes, etc.
	Advocacy: Continue collaboration with OC Affordable Housing Coalition.
	Advocacy: Advocate for potential OC and TOCH Bond funding to be used for AH.
	Advocacy: Advocate that TOH payment-in-lieu be used for AH.
Retool the Homeless Crisis Response System	Implement a Coordinated Entry system for people receiving housing and services in the homelessness system.
	Support the Community Empowerment Fund (administers Job Partners) to create a client-centered, multi-service center.
