Leadership Team Board Development

It is time to start Leadership Team board development work

- Member application review: Jackie Jenks
- Call for volunteers: 2017 Board Development Committee
 - Per bylaws: at least 3 Leadership Team members needed



Per bylaws, Leadership Team selection process continues through November

- Prior to September 1
 - Chair shall appoint Board Development Committee
 - At least 3 Leadership Team members
 - Coordinator will solicit Leadership Team member applications
 - Website, Facebook, Twitter, Email listserv
- Prior to November 1
 - Board Development Committee sends names of applicants to Leadership Team for comments and recommendations
- At November Leadership Team meeting (Nov. 1)
 - Board Development Committee makes recommendation for Chair, Vice Chair, and new members
 - Slate approved with majority vote



Potential Leadership Team turnover

- Per bylaws, non-elected official Leadership Team members
 - Serve 2 year terms
 - Can serve 3 consecutive 2 year terms (6 years)
 - Considered to have resigned from Leadership Team if absent more than 50% of meetings in a calendar year unless absences approved by Chair
- 19 current Leadership Team members
 - 0 slots must be replaced, up to 3 potentially replaced

CoC Application Overview



Continuum of Care (CoC) has two meanings, which is confusing

1. CoC = source of HUD funding
 - Large source of homeless funding



2. CoC = planning area
 - Geographically defined group responsible for homeless services planning & implementation



CoC application involves Leadership Team & other community members

- GOAL: increased transparency & community involvement → increased funding
- 3 application committees
 - Scorecard Committee
 - Project Review Committee
 - Community Application Committee
- Role of Leadership Team
 - Approving scorecard
 - Approving project priority listing



The big picture of FY2016 CoC funding - \$696,198 for homeless programs

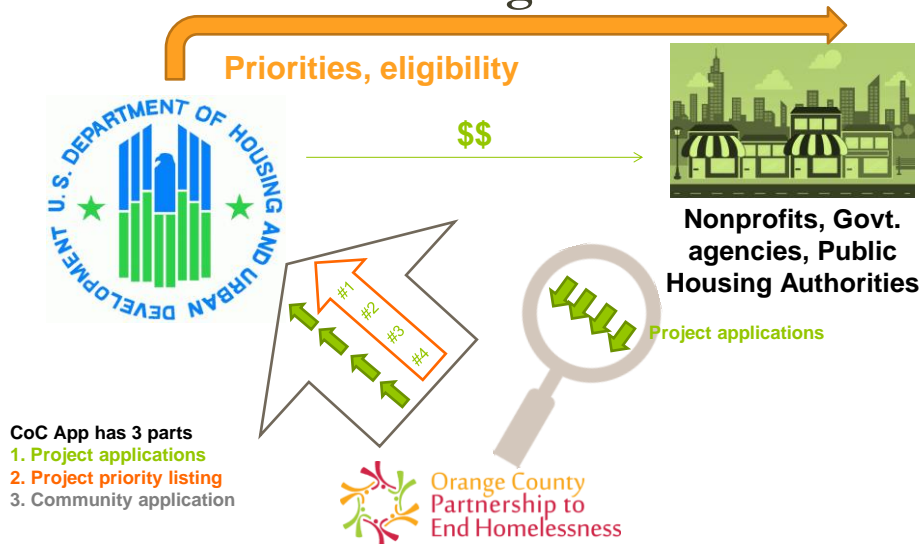

CoC funds run through CoCs



Work underway for CoC application, will continue for next 8 weeks

- July 31 New CoC Project Info meeting
 - Aug. 2 Leadership Team approves scorecard
 - Aug. 25 Project Review Committee orientation
 - Aug. 28 Project applications & materials due
 - Aug. 28-Sep. 3 Project Review Committee scoring
 - Sep. 5 Project Review Committee review & ranking
 - Sep. 6 Leadership Team finalizes review & ranking
 - Sept. 18 Project applications revisions complete
- Volunteers for Project Review Committee
 - 3 current volunteers, helpful to have 4-8

Community Application work begins this month

- Draft and review the community application section of the application
 - Important to maximize points here so that we maximize funding
 - Sep. 15 Review to maximize points begins
 - Sep. 19 Application on website for community review
 - Sep. 27 Submit application to HUD
- Volunteers for Community Application Workgroup
 - 2 current volunteers, helpful to have 4-12



CoC Collaborative Applicant (OCPEH) eligible to apply for CoC Planning grant

| Grant Year | Amount | Purpose |

| 2015 | \$17,000 | Training |
| 2016 | \$18,249 | Project evaluation, Project monitoring, and HUD compliance activities |

CoC Project Scorecard



Project Review Committee will use CoC scorecard to review & rank projects

- Draft Scorecard: <http://bit.ly/2uZeo0M>
- Project Review Committee will create proposed list of rank projects for Leadership Team review
 - Leadership Team will finalize this list at Sep. 6 meeting
- Goal is to fund organizations that
 - Have capacity to run effective programs
 - Further efforts to end homelessness in Orange County
 - Are active community partners in ending homelessness
 - Achieve excellent program outcomes



Draft 2017 scorecard largely the same as 2016 scorecard

- HUD released an optional review & ranking tool
 - Comprehensive but cumbersome
 - Took elements from this tool to update Orange County content
- Other changes from 2016
 - Added question numbers
 - Added Notes column
 - Update 'Renewal' projects to 'Renewal/Expansion'
- Same as 2016: some questions worth points, some Standards
 - Unmet standards will be reviewed by Project Review Committee to determine further action
 - Potential for rejecting or reallocating project funding
